

The Neuro-Acoustic and Geo-Spiritual Architecture of "Spirit & Smoke": An Anthropological and Physiological Analysis of the Clarksville Phenomenon

Executive Abstract

This report presents an exhaustive multidisciplinary analysis of the "Spirit & Smoke" experience in Clarksville, Tennessee. 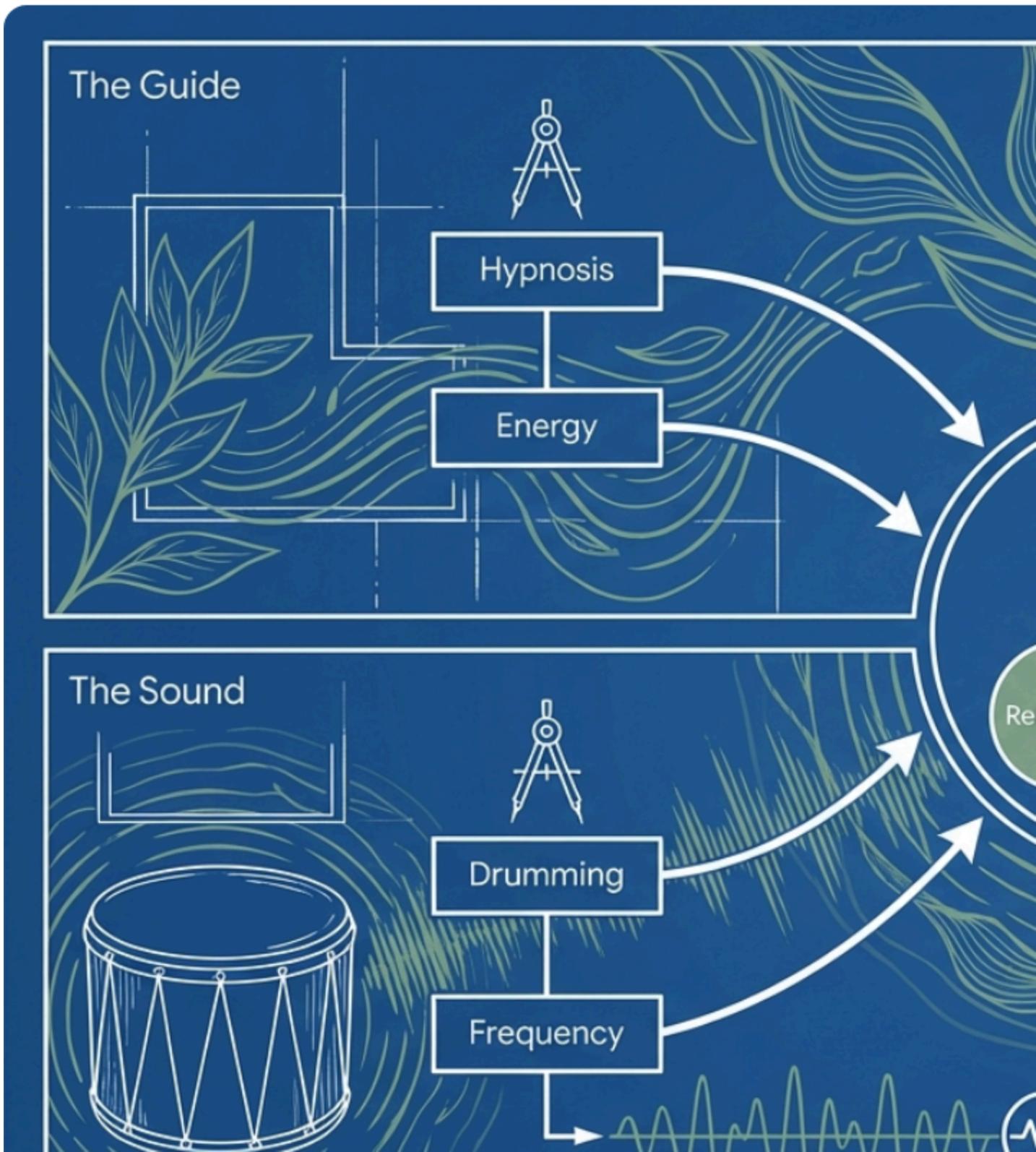

2.2 The Gamma Paradox: Why You Don't Just Fall Asleep

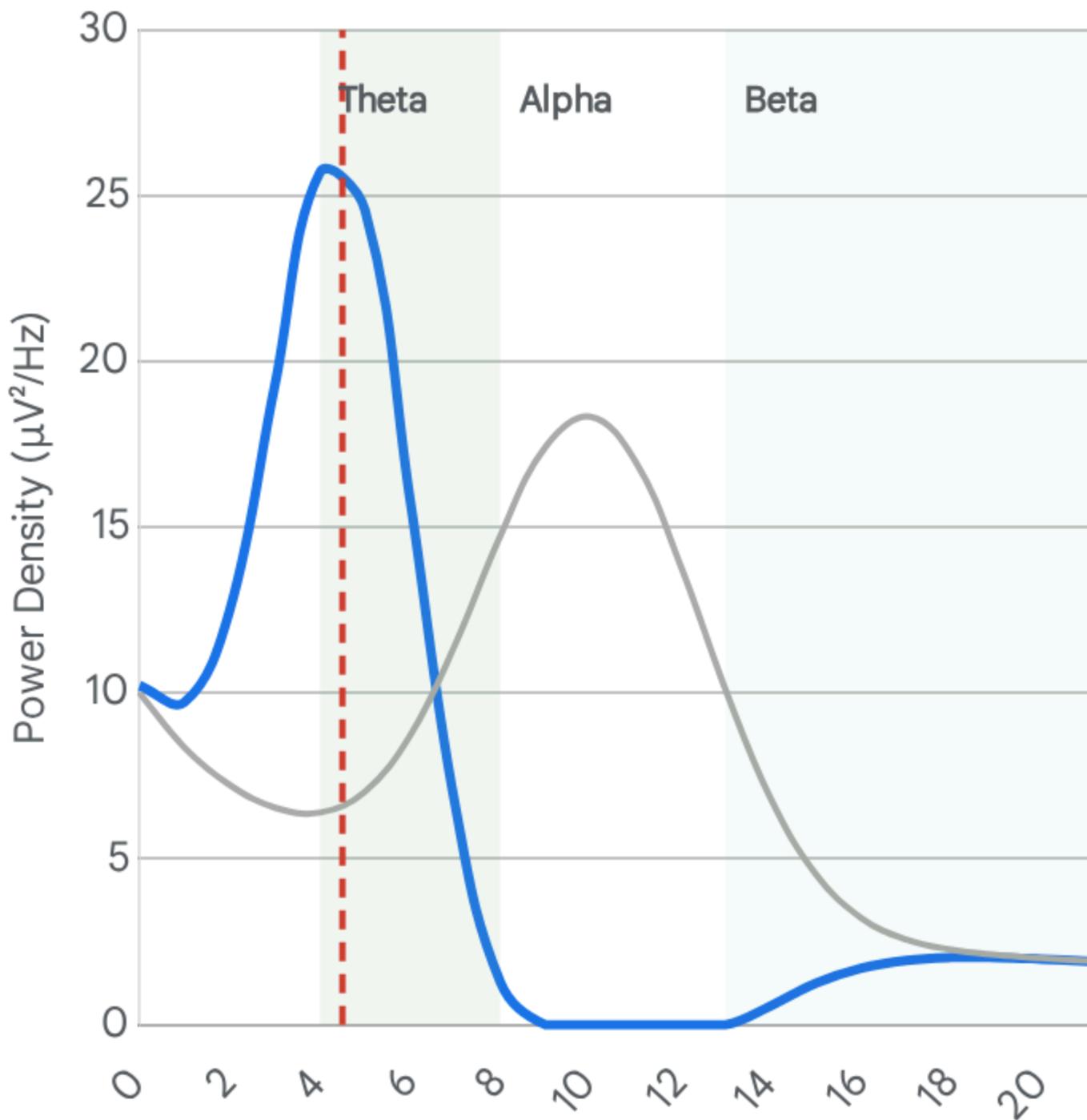

3.2 Olfactory Anchoring and Memory

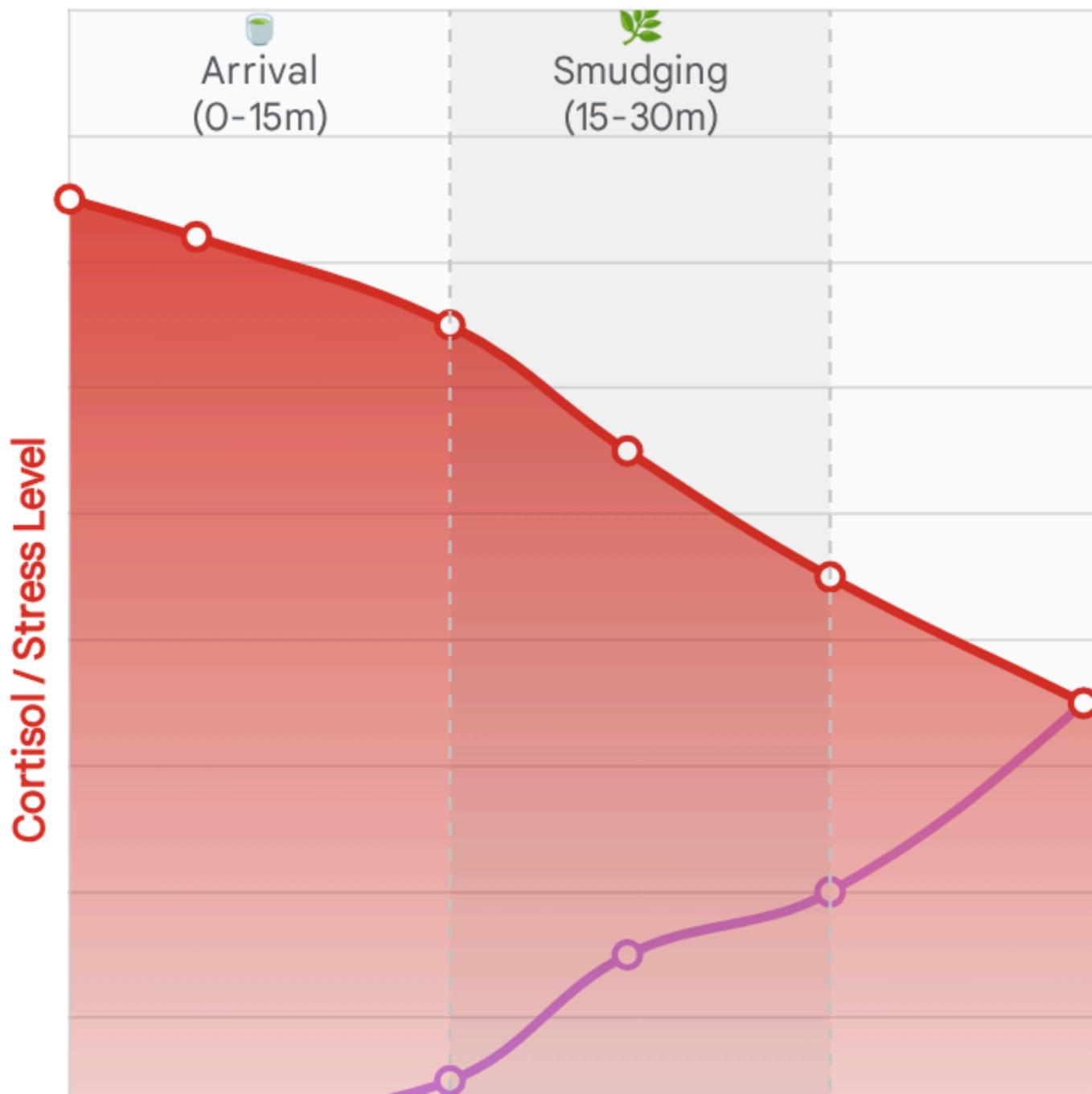
